<u>Question</u>	<u>Answer</u>	<u>Name of the part of the sentence.</u>
What is the action?	ate	Verb
Whos it that ate?	Sheila	Subject
What did she eat?	a peach	Direct Object
When did she eat it?	On Tuesday	Adverb of Time
How did she eat it?	slopply	Adverb of Manner
Where did she eat it?	under a tree.	Adverb of Location.

Indirect Object: answers the question to whom?, for whom? to what? for what but does not include no preposition. Comes before the direct object.

Yesterday, I threw Chris the ball quickly in the park.
